#### <u>Some Basic Rules to Ice Safety</u>

NEVER just assume the ice is safe. While some people may be out on the ice does not mean the entire lake is safe. Shallow water, coves and shaded areas freeze up first. These areas may be ok to walk on while the deeper, more open water may just be covered with a thin layer of dangerous ice. One quick way to check ice thickness is to use a cordless drill with a long wood auger bit. Another is an ice chisel or "spudbar". Ice thickness can greatly vary in short distances. Check the ice about every 100 feet or so. Early or late ice require more frequent checks. There is NO such thing as "safe ice".

Here are a few:

Never go out on the ice alone. Make sure you have proper safety equipment and a buddy.

Wear a personal floatation device under your winter gear. Wear appropriate footwear. Crampons are used to convert footwear for use on ice. Carry ice picks at all times.

Carry a rope with you.

Never walk or drive on cloudy ice.

Snow acts as an insulator - it makes ice warmer and weaker. Extreme cold snaps will weaken the ice.

Spring ice is NEVER safe Less than 2" - STAY OFF the ice.



#### CAMELOT ROUNDTABLE ASSOCIATION **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING**

Wednesday, January 15, 2014

<u>Call to Order</u> - President Lynn Johnston called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Board Members in attendance were Steve Schmidt, Matt Buczynski, Leah Allison, Brian Woertz, Gary Smith, Steve Harenberg and Bill Whitehurst; absent was board member Cathy Doss. Also in attendance was Glenda Carlson, Gen. Manager. Approval of Minutes — Bill Whitehurst made the motion to approve the December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2013 meeting minutes. Motion seconded by Steve Harenberg, All in favor- Motion carried.

Finance Report – Leah Allison presented the Finance Report. Monthly Income and Expense statement was reviewed for December 2013. A motion made by Gary Smith and seconded by Bill Whitehurst to transfer available funds to the reserve accounts as provided within the 2013 budget- \$15,000 to the Reserve for Replacement Fund (emergency repairs) and \$7,597.00 (less the \$8,403.00 expended in 2013) to the Erosion Control & Dredging Reserve. All in favor-Motion Carried. Discussion ensued regarding five (5) delinquent accounts that will have liens filed for dues owed from 2013, late fees, 9% finance charges (as allowed), filing fees and now the 2014 dues. The General Manager reported that this would be completed within the week and those members will be notified by mail. Remainder of delinquents (ten-10) currently have liens, foreclosure or a repayment plan The accounting firm of Rotherham & Co, is preparing to do the formal year end audit and review of Camelot Round Table including preparation of our annual tax returns for 2013. Mr. Rotherham anticipates completion by March 15, 2014.

**Recognition of Members and Guests** – In attendance were Collin Cochran, Greg Dennis, Janis Earle and Beth Emhoff.

#### **Committee Reports**

Infrastructure – Solicitation is still under way for additional members to the committee. Matt Buczynski reported Suzanne Wheeler is assisting in the solicitation of its new members and a list will be presented to the board for approval when available.

Land and Lakes - NO REPORT. Collin Cochran did pass out information as previously submitted to the board from the Land & Lakes committee to its new members. Approval of the Committee will occur at the next meeting, Collin Cochran will gather the necessary information to confirm the Land & Lakes Chairperson for 2014.

Health and Environment - NO REPORT

Covenant Review – Lynn Johnston reported that the committee plans to turn its recommendations over to the board by the date specified within their timeline (02-28-14) as they are on schedule. They have completed the final review of the Covenants and will be moving on to the By-laws. The next meeting is January 28<sup>th</sup>, 2014 at 6:30 p.m. in the Clubhouse. All members are invited to attend for the first half hour of this meeting with questions, ideas and concerns.

Security Report – Brian Emhoff submitted a written report that all has been quiet with the exception of patrons ice fishing of the lake without a member. No incidents of written violation to report.

As always, volunteers are needed to make these events happen and your help is always appreciated.

Parking Lot Pole Light – Recently fixed in June is out again. Management was instructed to begin search for a band with suggestions coming in from board and members for possibilities.

Call to Order – Having met the requisite quorum of ten members, the Annual Meeting of the Camelot Round Table Association was called to order at 2:01 pm by President Brandon Carroll. <u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Don Thompson made the motion, seconded by Steve Schmidt to approve the minutes of the 2012 Annual meeting. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's 2012 Financial Report</u> - Treasurer Leah Allison reviewed the financial report.

<u>President's Report</u> – President Carroll reviewed the previous year, highlighting many of the accomplishments. Thanks were noted for the strong attendance at the annual meeting and appreciation for the candidates that have volunteered to serve the community in the upcoming year. Thanks to the General Manager, Staff, Security, maintenance team, and the many volunteers for their service through the year.

#### **Committee Reports**

**Infrastructure** – A report was reviewed highlighting that many projects are to be planned and volunteers for the committee are needed.

Land & Lakes – A report was submitted and read by Collin Cochran. The report reviewed the mission and goals of the committee, and progress made through the year. Members of the committee present were recognized for their service to the community and the importance of maintaining the lakes as a key asset.

**Health & Environment** - No Report; Sabrina Petesch was recognized as Lake Camelot Volunteer of the Year, for her service in representing the community interests in relationship to the Peoria County Health regulations.

LC Swim Team —Beth Dains reported on the submitted report, reviewing a successful year. Thanks go out to many for all the efforts. Beth and Julie Amerman, the head coach, will both be retiring from their respective positions.

**LC Baseball** – Leah Allison reviewed the submitted report, and recognized the staff for the maintenance of the fields. Thanks to the community for the continuing support.

Activities Club – Co-President Kristy Bushart submitted a written annual report recognizing over 10 events throughout the year, of which the various funds raised go back to our community in many ways. The Activities Club is always looking for new members and can use volunteers.

**Sportsman's Club** - Board Member Bill Whitehurst highlighted the Sportsman's club contributions through the year including the 4<sup>th</sup> of July festivities, Fish Fry, Wine Tastings, Pavilion renovation, and the New Year's Eve event.

<u>2014 Proposed Budget Presentation</u> – President Carroll reviewed the proposed budget for 2014, recognizing the proposed budget will increase dues to accommodate increased expenses, but more importantly to continue increasing the funds for significant future expenses. Much discussion was held with the large audience. Numerous concerns with the amount of the dues increase were highlighted; areas of potential reduction in expenses were also suggested by the membership and noted. After over 100 minutes of discussion, a motion was made by Tadd Swanson, and seconded by Janis Earle to approve the budget. A roll call vote was taken and the budget was not approved with 21 votes for, and 32 votes against. A recess was taken. After a return to session, further discussion and debate was held, with a motion made by Bruce Whelchel, seconded by Janis Earle for an amended budget allowing for a 5% increase in Dues. A roll call vote was taken and the budget was approved with 31 votes for, and 19 votes against.

Nomination Committee Report and Election Results – Committee Chairman Don Thompson reviewed the election results. There were 118 ballots submitted, with the results: Matt Buczynski – 87; Brian Woertz – 75; Cathy Doss – 74: Gary Smith – 55; Steve Harenberg – 32; Janis Earle – 8; Erica West – 7; Troy Deiss – 6; Dan Hordesky – 2; Collin Cochran – 2; and Sara Skolaski – 2. One (1) vote each was received for the following people: Vicky Cluskey, Bruce Whelchel, Don Thompson, Mike Haffner, Chris Wright, Danny Bushart, Ryan Murphy, Jeff Hazen, Craig Johnson, Chad Batterham, Mike Bonneville, Bruce Beitz, Anthony Almasi, Kevin Wolfer, Sabrina Petesch, Bill Krokos and Mike Stender. President Carroll congratulated the top vote getters and welcomed Matt, Brian, Cathy, Gary & Steve to the board. He explained that they will be seated at the December board meeting.

#### 2013 BUDGET vs. Actual Cost OVERVIEW

<u>Total Income</u>- \$10,000+ over anticipated annual income. Association received payment of current dues, back dues, late fees, finance charges, attorneys fees & reimbursements due from one delinquent lot sold in 2013.

**Expenses** - Administrative Salaries & Payroll Taxes- Office hours increase allowed for full-time assistant during the summer and part time 20 hours per winter-/Budget Adjustment made for 2014;

Mileage & Vehicle Repairs-New Battery , Heater Core & 2 Tires purchased for RTA Truck/Additional Cost of Fuel for Mowing Of Vacant/Foreclosed Lots, Brake Replacement and Annual Maintenance Check on Tractor contributed to additional costs;

Lake Repairs & Maintenance-Larger than normal volumes of spraying were needed due to algae blooms (maintenance personnel taking classes this March to become certified applicators to help offset costs for spraying in future), silt pond behind water tower became clogged and had to be cleaned out (Hydro-Vac), and replacement of concrete at lower boat ramp (\$4,400+) contributed to additional costs (Callicotte, Inc);

Erosion Control Lakes - Erosion Control Projects approved by the board and completed by the Land and Lakes Committee with funds coming out of the Reserve for Dredging & Erosion Control for 2014 (2013 Budget-\$16,000 spent \$8,403 placed \$7,597 in Erosion & Dredging Reserve account at year end)

Pool Repairs & Maintenance- Replacement of Main Pump at the Pool needed due to lightening strike (\$1,516.50- Mack Pump & Equipment) and Plumbing Pipe Leak & Shut-off Valve Repair from Water Line in Center Median to Pool House (\$5,600.00- Fauser Plumbing);

Pool Licensing - New this year - required by State of Illinois to pay for licensing for each of three pools totaling \$950 and then inspections for each total \$300/Licensing fees were received prior to 2014 budgeting and included in costs for next year-\$100 per pool inspection fee was not received until after budgeting process was approved so will need to be included in future budgets beginning the following year (2015).

Patrol-Peoria County- Off-duty officer hired to patrol RTA grounds, boat ramps, baseball diamond and clubhouse area to help enforce county regulations and our curfew in these areas. Continued coverage has been allowed for in the 2014 Operating Budget.

Currently our records, receipts, reports, reconciliations and payroll information are with our accountant whom is performing the Annual Audit and Review of 2013 for the Association, while preparing the Annual Tax Return. Detail information may not be readily available until we receive our records back but we will be happy to answer any questions for you as quickly as possible. \*Future newsletters will include monthly budget comparisons with actual vs. budgeted overviews.


