





July 15, 2015

<u>Call to Order</u> – President Steve Harenberg called the meeting to order at 6:35p.m. Board Members present were Gary Smith, Matt Buczynski, Cody Martzluf, Cathy Doss, and Brian Woertz. Absent were Bo Pratt and Leah Allison. Also present was Glenda Carlson, General Manager.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Cathy Doss made a motion to accept the June 17th, 2015 minutes. Cody Martzluf seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried. <u>Finance Report</u> – Glenda Carlson, GM, reported the financial statement for June to the Board and Members. The Finance Report was approved as presented. <u>Recognition of Members and Guests</u> – In attendance was Bernie Sieks, Lot 665; Greg Dennis, Lot 553; Jim Sinclair, Lot 477; Mike and Janice Bonneville, Lot 556; John Hecker, Lot 350; Danny Bushart, Lot 573; Suzanne Wheeler, Lot 562; Dave Johnston, Lot 479; Mike Johnston, Lot 498; Jerry Langenbahn, Lot 869; and Robert Wilder, Lot 122.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Infrastructure</u> – Jim Sinclair reported that they have updated the list of potential projects upcoming and are working on estimated costs for repairs and/or replacements. They will be taking a tour of our facility to confirm a complete list. Please read their report in this paper.

ECC- APPLICATIONS

Matt Buczynski made a motion to accept all of the ECC recommendations that were approved, seconded by Bill Krokos. They were: Spenny, Lot 481-10x20 Deck; Johnston, Lot 498-Gazebo and Wooden Swing Set; Sieks, Lot 665-Extenseion of Date for Dock Work; Martzluf, Lot 1002-Concrete Patio and Shed; Langenbahn, Lot 869-add Boat Dock and Stairs, has to resubmit for Boat Slip and Beach; Scott, Lot 900/901- application of a Fire Pit. Matt Buczynski made a motion to allow Fire Pit on Lot 900/901. It was seconded by Bill Krokos. There were 6 yeas and 1 nay (Cathy Doss). Motion carried; Bonneville, Lot 555/556-Garden Enclosure. This was a long discussion before Gary Smith made a motion to allow garden enclosure. From March 1st-November 1st this will coincide with the county codes for boats. They must all come down each year. It was seconded by Brian Woertz. There were 6 yeas and 1 nay (Cathy Doss). Motion carried.

LOGAN TOWNSHIP/REPAIR CULVERT NEAR UPPER BOAT DOCK- Logan is fixing their culvert in this area. We are looking into ours. It is not in good shape. It is approximately a 200' run. The estimate is around \$18,000.00 to repair.

LAKE TREATMENT UPDATE- Greg Dennis report on treatment of the lakes. It has been difficult because of all the rain but they feel they have a good handle on it. They continue to monitor the weed growth and apply treatments as needed. Thanks to Greg Dennis and Dennis Woods for all your work.

<u>WEIR DAM/DELAMINATION OF CONCRETE OVERLAY REPAIR-</u> Greg Dennis reported some evidence of delamination of a concrete overlay repair on the weir dam. He stated he would like to take another look at it when there is not so much water. Steve Harenberg will be also discussing this with the folks who are checking out the bridge.

EROSION CONTROL AREAS/ROADS- Due to the large amounts of rains received this year the road commissions offices and management have received several calls with regards to wash-out areas that have been identified near or under roads in Lake Camelot. These are being inspected and addressed. Please report any damage in these areas to either office.

JUNIOR HIGH DANCE COORDINATOR- Dances start in September. The kids really enjoy these dances. A Dance Coordinator is still needed and not finding an adequate replacement may result in the demise of the junior high dances. It is the third Friday each month, from September to May. Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 6:30. In attendance were Glenda Carlson, Collin Cochran, Glen DeLorme, Lynn Gosnell, Steve Harenberg, John Hecker, Deb Metroff, Bernie Sieks, and Bruce Whelchel. RTA Board member Cathy Doss was also in attendance.

Report on the June Board Meeting: Steve gave a brief report on the meeting.

Approve Revised Committee Goals for 2015: Based on the establishment of the Ad-hoc Dredging Committee, the committee discussed and approved the revised Committee Goals for 2015.

- 1. When needed, share information and work with the Ad-hoc Dredging Committee.
- 2. Continue to identify and correct erosion problems. Develop plans to move forward on previously prioritized erosion problem areas. In addition, develop long term budget plans.
- 3. Develop plans that deal with the major issues in the *Dam Inspection* and *Bridge Inspection* Reports.
- 4. Research and make recommendations to the Board regarding a plan that will maintain and improve our lakes as first class fisheries. Continue to work with the Sportsman Club and State of Illinois Biologist.
- 5. Research and develop plans to control vegetation, through alternatives other than chemicals, that will create more healthy lakes and reduce sedi-accumulation (i.e. mechanical equipment and aeration systems).
- 6. Finalize the Dam Safety and Maintenance Manual and work with the GM to implement the plan that addresses the yearly dam inspection report.
- 7. Prepare a prioritized list of projects for the next Budget (due by 10-1-15).
- 8. Work with the Long Range Planning committee to develop a long term budget plan.

Erosion Control Project for 2014—the West End of Lake Lancelot:

The committee discussed and reviewed progress since the last committee meeting. It was reported that the majority of the dirt has been removed. Steve recommends that no more dirt be removed from the site. The committee also discussed the need for more rock in and around the culverts to prevent further failure of the land bridge. The committee agreed that the contractor needs to fulfill his obligation as outlined in the contract. Glenda will get copies of the contract to Steve and Bruce before they meet with the contractor to discuss the remaining work on the project.

Develop Plans for 2015 and a 30 Year Plan for Erosion Control: The committee discussed the methodology for moving the plan forward and reaffirmed that we need to get erosion under control. Based on the responsibilities of the Ad-hoc Dredging Committee, the committee discussed the need to revise the Budget plan that the committee submitted to the Board last September. The committee discussed a copy of a revised plan that included our prioritized erosion problem areas. The Committee agreed to continue working at the west end of Lake Lancelot. These areas listed on the Plan as 11, 12, 13 & 14 will be the committee's initial focus. Steve suggested speaking with the farmers that own the fields that drain through areas 13 & 14. Bruce will contact Scott, with the USDA, to determine the best approach for contacting the land owners. Bruce will also request a list of approved contractors for future projects. Collin, Steve and Bruce will continue to reassess the previously prioritized areas and any additional areas that we need to consider. In addition to analyzing the *Hydro-graphic and Sediment Survey*, they will try to look at areas that appear to need attention.

It was also reported that Kevin Sipp the Limestone Township Road Commissioner worked on areas 3 & 4. They replaced one culvert and verified the severe deterioration of the remaining culverts. The workers also discovered a cistern that the culverts were feeding into before draining into the lake. No further work was done until the problem areas are evaluated in more detail.

Major Issues in the Dam Inspection and Bridge Inspection Reports: The committee needs to analyze what caused the problems and develop short term and long term ideas to solve/fix the problems. Steve and Bruce will work on the major issues in the Reports.

Dam Safety & Maintenance Manual that Includes our Emergency Action Plan: The final information for the Manual has been collected and just needs to be typed and printed. Bruce is working on completing. John volunteered to assist.




