GEESE AND OUR LAKES

Like it or not, the geese have adapted to living well among us. They have a weak migratory instinct and will stay in place as long as there is ice free water and available food. Since people are willing to feed them and often keep their lakes partially ice-free in the winter, the geese have begun sticking around in suburbia. They have become accustomed to cars, planes and other noises of modern life. In fact, they are so used to cars that they are willing to walk out in front of oncoming traffic, secure in the knowledge that cars will stop in the road for them.

The landscape contains food and space to support a few geese without causing too much difficulty for people. We find geese like to stay where they are hatched, in the same way most migrating geese tend to return to the same spots year after year. The lack of predators and abundance of food allows geese to lay more eggs and have more goslings survive to adulthood than would be normal in the wild. So what would normally be a small population can quickly grow into a large population. One goose can contribute the same as dumping a 100 lb bag of fertilizer with a "10" phosphorus number into the lake each year.! Yikes! Phosphorus contributes to large amounts of our weed growth.

There are three changes that can be easily accomplished on most lakes: 1) Don't feed the geese, 2) modify the shoreline stabilization 3) allow the lake to freeze over in the winter, if possible. #1 being the easiest to accomplish, we ask as we have in the past - PLEASE DO NOT FEED THE GEESE!

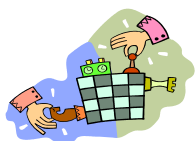

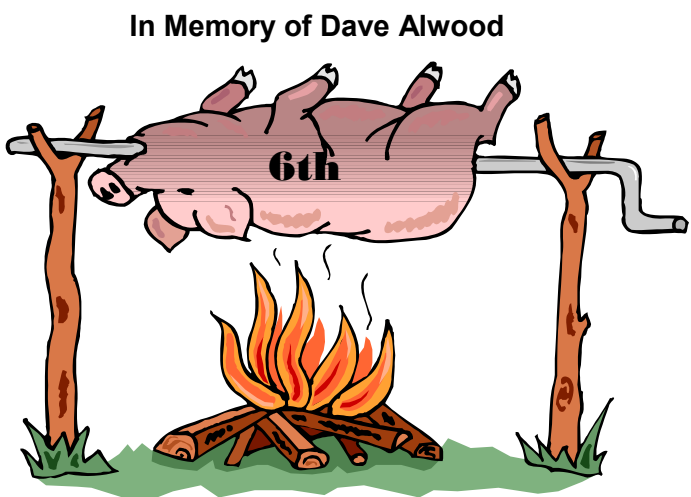

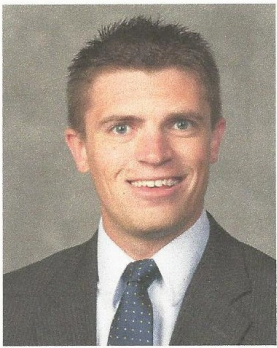

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
Wednesday, August 20, 2014
(unapproved meeting minutes)

Call to Order –President Lynn Johnston called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. Board Members in attendance were Steve Harenberg, Steve Schmidt, Gary Smith, Brian Woertz, William Whitehurst and Cathy Doss. Leah Allison arrived late & Matt Buczynski was absent. Present was Glenda Carlson, General Mgr.

Approval of Minutes – Steve Harenberg made a motion to approve the July 16, 2014 minutes with the correction of the adjournment time to 10:17p.m, seconded by Steve Schmidt. Motion carried.

Finance Report – Leah Allison presented the Finance Report. Monthly Income and Expense statement was reviewed for July 2014 and approved.

Recognition of Members and Guests – In attendance were Vicky Cluskey, Jim Sinclair, Teri & John Goldsmith, Mike Manuel, Greg & Vickie Mulligan, Terry and Donna Wignall, Scott Wright, Glen DeLorme, Brian Emhoff, Collin Cochran, Brian Cunningham, Sabrina Petesch, Janis Earle, Bill Krokos and Dave Johnston. Member John Goldsmith spoke with regards to a formal written complaint which had been filed with the Lake Camelot office and endorsed by some of the surrounding lots/homes on Diamond Point regarding the new construction build on Lot 927. Their concerns with the non-completion of the material covering required on the driveway and the installation of the flat roof/steel roof were discussed. The board informed members they were not aware of a final inspection by the county having yet been performed on the property nor any issues of non-compliance by the county with the original print that was filed with that office prior to the build. Once complete, the ECC will also make a final inspection, however, it was noted the print does show the installation of the steel roof and the flat roof that was presented and approved through the proper committees at Lake Camelot. Mr. Goldsmith presented photographs of the roof (s). Further discussion ensued with a request that homeowners of Section 7A & 7B being notified prior to any other builds as such within the properties covering their declaration and restrictive covenants be presented to them prior to approval. It was explained that although Section 7A & 7B currently have their own recorded declaration of restrictive covenants with requirements on the build of certain lots; these are otherwise the same and will be incorporated within the blue book and recorded as one when the new declaration and by-laws are recorded prior to January 1, 2015. The board will continue through recommendation from the ECC to approve the application of new constructions built at Lake Camelot. No action was taken.

Committee Reports

Infrastructure – Jim Sinclair was present and reported that his committee had not yet met for this month and would be looking towards the Board for direction on the progression of the bathroom renovations. General Manager Glenda Carlson stated that while we have 3 bids from the committee on complete restoration of the bathrooms, it was her understanding the Board had previously asked to also receive 3 bids for upgrades that would put a new cost of paint on the walls, replace the deteriorating countertop and any leaking fixtures, etc.; a minor renovation until funds could be put in the budget to completely renovate them. She stated that currently this year there was \$4,000 in the clubhouse budget to do work in the upstairs bathrooms as projected. Brian Woertz made a motion, seconded by Gary Smith to proceed with cost projection of materials needed and the work to be performed in-house by maintenance. Motion carried.

Land and Lakes – Collin Cochran and Steve Harenberg reported on the work being done at the siltation pond at Harker's Corner. (See Land and Lakes Report from meeting (Page 7) It was reported dirt may be taken from the project but it does belong to the subcontractor as part of the agreement and any member wanting to take more than a couple of buckets should contact the office and set up a time and the subcontractor may be contacted so he may help and the berm will not be disrupted. Please be sure to contact the office prior to taking any of your own equipment to remove any of this dirt. Management apologized for the removal of goose nests from lake without member notice.

Health and Environment – Gary Smith -NO REPORT/ Sabrina Petesch reported on her committee with Peoria County that they are currently working on an online homeowners assistance video for septic owners that will help people in the care of their tanks and fields. This is a work in progress.

Covenant Review – Lynn Johnston turned the reporting over to Janis Earle and Sabrina Petesch. Janis said the committee is on hold while the proposed changes are being reviewed. Sabrina stated that she has begun the review and is about ready to meet with the board to review the work they have done with the declaration and covenants. A meeting, will be set within the first two weeks of September.

Security Report – Brian Emhoff submitted a written report to the board for review. He stated no other information to submit subsequent to report.

Club Reports

Activities Club – Cathy Doss reported that the turnout for the Family Trivia was poor and the Activities Club hopes to have a greater showing should they decide to do it again next year. Garage Sale is September 20th, same day as the pig roast. The next trivia night is 10-10-14 for Tazewell County Resource Center. The Activities Club agreed to participate in the purchase of new chaise lounges for the pool -twelve @ \$99.00 each plus tax approx \$1,200+.

Sportsman's Club - The club is getting ready for the Pig Roast to be held on September 20, 2014. Tickets are available at the Lake Camelot Office

Bill Whitehurst made a motion for No business sign endorsements to be put up in Lake Camelot just real estate signs (per the covenants and charity/yard sale signs upon approval to come down immediately following the event. All other applications to be approved as stated above. Motion seconded by Steve Harenberg. Motion carried.

Old Business

2014 Violations/Tree Removals– Discussion was held regarding the size and complexity of removing the tree in the lake front of Lot 187. It was approved for the tree in lake to be cut down further if applicable when the lake is lowered, Mr. Greg Mulligan offered to do it for the owner of this property. Bill Whitehurst made a motion, seconded by Steve Harenberg for the tree to addressed when the lake is lowered. Motion carried. Management reported due to the increasing number of calls regarding garbage cans being left out other than days the garbage is being picked up, reminder notices have been sent to those not in compliance.

Lake Spraying/Update: Greg Dennis and Dennis Woods are staying on top of this. The Board feels they are doing a GREAT job .! Big thanks guys!

Reserve/Replacement Study: Still In Progress

Mapping Bids: The Mapping Network people spend 2 1/2 days on the lakes. Preliminary reports have been submitted to the board awaiting Hydrographic Maps expected to be received within the next week to two.

Fish Stocking: The General Manager reported she had spoken with Rob Hilsabeck in regards to the fall fish stocking recommendation and he stated that since we did both walleye and catfish last year (due to nothing in 2012) that we go back to staggering them every other year and this year do 500 channel catfish in each lake along with his annual recommendation of muskie. After discussion on the advantages and disadvantages of purchasing or not purchasing muskie, a motion was made by Cathy Doss and seconded by Steve Harenberg to purchase 500 8"-10" Channel catfish each lake. Motion carried.

Nominations Committee-Redraft of Committee Rules was submitted to Board for approval. Leah Allison made a motion, seconded by Steve Schmidt to accept the new draft as submitted. Motion carried. Nominations are being accepted Aug 15th through September 30th. Candidate application forms in office.

Red Cross Blood Drive: Huge Success! Projected 29 Donors were able to secure 30 out of 36. Thank You to all the people that gave!!!

LED Lighting Program: S & S is waiting for the bulbs to come in. Installation being done with a program in conjunction with Ameren, We pay \$249 only!

New Business

USDA/Land & Lakes Meeting: To be held on September 15, 2014 from 4:30 to 6:30 pm. To discuss our watershed, financial assistance available to agricultural land owners and ways we can help each other with erosion problems. Meeting open to our members but must sign up with office to attend. Refreshments!

Parking Lot Bids- General Manager submitted three bids to be used for budgeting for overlay of blacktop parking lot and two boat ramps. Bill Krokos recommended the submission of a bid by Pekin City Ice and Coal General Manager will call for a bid.

Critter Control: Resetting traps after the weekends. It has been reported that no beavers have been caught & they have taken down as many as 25 small trees.

Executive Session

The Board went into Executive Session at 10:00 p.m. with a motion by Steve Schmidt, seconded by Gary Smith. All in favor.

The Board came out of Executive Session at 10:50 p.m. with a motion by Steve Harenberg, seconded by Leah Allison. All in favor.

Action Items – Resulting from Executive Session-

Motion was made by Gary Smith to have Dennis Woods work past September closing of the pool on bathroom renovations with Greg Dennis as needed. Steve Schmidt seconded. Motion carried. Motion was made by Steve Schmidt to have Sherry Waters work in office as needed for hours up to two weeks (budgeted) not used over the summer due to vacation and illness starting October 1st, seconded by Leah Allison. Motion carried.

Adjournment – Steve Schmidt made the motion, seconded by Leah Allison to adjourn the meeting at 11:00 p.m. Motion carried.

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Minutes - Land & Lakes Committee
Wednesday, August 6, 2014

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:33 p.m. Committee members in attendance were Glenda Carlson, Collin Cochran, Glen DeLorme, Lynn Gosnell, Steve Harenberg, Keith Johnson and Deb Metroff. Guests in attendance were Brian Cunningham and Vickie Mulligan.

Report on the June 18th Board Meeting: Collin Cochran gave a brief report on the meeting.

Erosion Control Project Number 1 (from 2013): The committee would like to thank maintenance for burning the trees by the baseball field. The contractor pushed all remaining trees from the area, and dressed the lower dam areas in preparation for seeding. The area was seeded, but the seed did not take; the contractor will take care of this.

Dam and Bridge Inspection Reports:
1. Dam Inspection Report from Foth - No progress to report.
2. Bridge Inspection Report from Foth - No progress to report.
The Board has requested that our committee research repairs for the bridge and spillway. It was Collin’s impression that the Board would like estimates for both short term repairs and long term major repairs and/or replacement..

Erosion Control and Siltation Projects for 2014
Siltation Pond at the West End of Lake Lancelot:

Work remaining includes:
North bank of silt pond: Dredge siltation pond with Long Reach Excavator in area that could not be reached with other excavator.
2. Dredge West end of Lake Lancelot with Long Reach Excavator..
3. Reshape area and haul dredged material (As part of the bid, the contractor has rights to the material).
4. Line both sides and top of the new “access road to the south bank of silt pond” with rock.
5. Build check dam..
6. Cleanup areas and reseed.
In order to hold equipment rental costs down, the contractor is waiting for the bench areas to dry out before we can safely bring the equipment back in to complete the project..

Siltation Pond at the North End of Lake Camelot:

Work completed includes:
1. Reshaped the area and seeded.
Work remaining includes:
1. Minor clean-up and reshaping.


Erosion Control and Siltation for 2014:
1. Removing Lake Siltation: Glenda reported that the Board has voted to have Mapping Network come in and conduct a Bathymetric and Sediment survey on both lakes. The cost for this survey is \$16,950.00. Glenda passed out information that details this process. The surveying has already begun.
2. Strategy for working with neighboring land owners to control erosion into our lakes: Glenda will contact Scott Wallace from the USDA-NCRS to set up meeting.
3. The park access area that runs between Tewksbury and Canterbury: Bernie is making great progress. He has requested a load of rip rap to be purchased to continue his work. Glenda will get with Bernie regarding this purchase. Thanks Bernie.
4. Developing plans for working on additional prioritized erosion problem areas. Tabled.

Dam Safety & Maintenance Manual that includes our Emergency Action Plan: Deb will acquire the remaining few names from the residents along Lancaster Road.


New Business
1. Discussed trees that have fallen into the lakes. Committee agreed that the homeowner is responsible for the removal of their trees that have fallen into the lake.
2. Brian passed out information on “The Dino Six Sediment Removal System”. This information will be discussed at the next committee meeting in September.

Septic System - F.A.Q.


Odors inside the house.
Septic odors in the house are usually from a dry drain. Drains in your house have a trap associated with it. The trap is the U-shaped pipe you see under your kitchen sink. The purpose of this pipe is to keep the gases from your septic system from being able to come back inside the house. The trap works because water sits in the belly section of pipe, and the gases can't get back up through the drain. If the water in that trap dries up, then the gases are able to escape. Water evaporates out of these traps if they aren't used frequently, or heaters also dry up the traps. Usually it's a basement drain, unused bathroom or some fixture that just isn't used very regularly. Add water to the drain!

What kind of toilet paper should I use?
Most toilet papers are septic safe. Look for a toilet paper that says, "septic safe." Toilet paper breaks down very easily and quickly. Facial tissue, paper towels and baby wipes do NOT break down easily like organic material does and should never be flushed down a toilet. Do not use anything in a septic that is not biodegradable.

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Septic System - F.A.Q.'s Continued

How often should I pump my septic system?
We recommend that you pump your septic system every 203 years. Garbage disposers also increase the solid waste load on septic tanks and may require that the tank be pumped more often. Aerobic units need to be pumped more often, approximately every year (unless part time occupancy, then every 2-3 years but no more).

How do I know if I have a system failure?
Drains become slow or backup anywhere in the system. Discharge of effluent to the surface, stream etc. Depressions or low areas over the septic tank, septic drain field depressions. Grass over septic field is extra green. Septic smell in the yard. Spongy earth over the septic system.

Pumping: Septic tanks which are not pumped often enough can become filled with sludge, becoming totally impacted, such systems have sent solids into the leach field, shortening its life.
