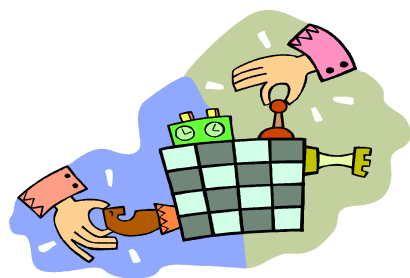

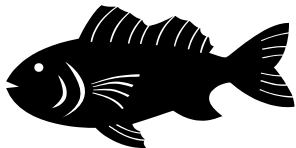
The 2015 Lake Camelot 4th of July Festivities are going to be a two day event!!!

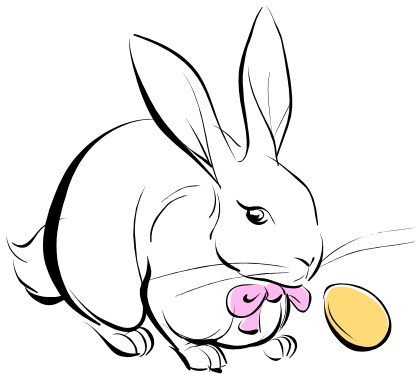

Minutes - Land & Lakes Committee Minutes
Tuesday, March 10, 2015

Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. In attendance were Glenda Carlson, Collin Cochran, Glen DeLorme, Lynn Gosnell, John Hecker, Deb Metroff, and Bernie Sieks.

Report on the February Board Meeting: Collin Cochran

Erosion Control and Siltation Projects for 2014 - the North End of Lake Camelot and the West End of Lake Lancelot: Committee agreed that there is no way to access some of the area because it is private property and permission to access the property was denied. There is still silt to be removed at the North End, however we will have to wait until the roads have been reopened.

Discuss Failure on Concrete Cylinder that Housed the Input for the Water Treatment Plant. Plant removed in 1999. Illinois American claims no responsibility for the cylinder. The committee agreed that the cylinder has been deteriorating for years and recommends taking the time to research the best approach for repairs. If the Board agrees, we will plan on doing the repairs when the lake is lowered this fall.

Development of Plans for 2015 and a 30 Year Plan that Focuses on: 1) Erosion Control, 2) Sediment Removal, 3) Aeration, and 4) the Dam Inspection and Bridge Inspection Reports: 1) & 2) At the conference Glenda attended, she was introduced to a company that will come out to our community to analyze the situation with our lakes. Because we have already done the Hydrographic and Sediment survey, this service will be done at no charge. The committee feels this will be a good first step towards developing the 2015 and the 30 year plan. 3) Some committee members feel it is time to look into aeration for certain areas of the lake. An area was suggested, but more information needs to be gathered. Glenda will check into cost to run, cost to purchase/lease etc. 4) Glenda and Colin will follow up with other committee members regarding companies that were recommended to come out and analyze the issues and estimate the cost for repair. The committee agreed that this work should be hired out.

Dam Safety & Maintenance Manual that Includes our Emergency Action Plan: Deb will obtain the remaining information for the next Committee meeting.

Other Business: The committee agreed to support Rob’s recommendations for stocking the lakes.

Adjournment: Meeting adjourned at 7:57 p.m.

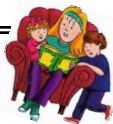

Tuesday, February 11, 2015

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:30 PM. Committee members in attendance were Jim Sinclair, Matt Buczynski, Kevin Arduini and Suzanne Wheeler. Absent - Darrel Hedman.

Report on the January 21 Board Meeting: Board approved Kevin Arduini as a new member of the committee.

Long-Range Planning Process: No Project Request Forms were received to consider.

Parking Lot Oil & Rock sealing project: Darrel Hedman provided the committee with literature describing alternatives to oil & rock to seal the main club house and boat ramp parking lots prior to the meeting. There are three – 1) seal with the black sealer seen at many businesses; 2) fix the bad spots and oil & rock seal everything; or 3) fix the bad spots then overlay the rest of the parking lot. The first alternative would not give us as many years (maybe two years) as the oil & rock seal. The last alternative is too expensive as the Board saw in quotes received last year. The committee believes the second alternative is the best at this time and will wait until March when the thawing has started to set a time to visit the three lots with contractors to assess the situation and obtain bids.

30-Year Planning project: Kevin Arduini will contact the Land & Lakes committee chairman to coordinate a meeting to discuss 1) adding their input into the matrix below for the next two years and 2) timeline for adding expected projects for years three to ten including best estimates and timing.

Reserve Study: The ILRPC will review this list at the March meeting to begin adding projects, estimated costs, and year needed to the matrix below.

Tuesday, March 10, 2015

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM. Committee members in attendance were Jim Sinclair, Matt Buczynski, Kevin Arduini, Suzanne Wheeler, and Darrel Hedman. Guest – Brian Woertz

Report on the February 18 Board Meeting: Board discussed RTA boat slips and suggested that a Project Request Form be completed and submitted for the ILRPC consideration.

Long-Range Planning Process:

Boat Slip Project Proposal: Brian Woertz submitted a Project Request Form to add boat slips at the north end of the swimming beach. He included two estimates for three docks that could hold six boats for under \$10,000. He suggested that we probably need lights and maybe a security camera. He has a list of seven people willing to pay \$500 for the season (April 1st to October 1st) at this point. The committee discussed this with Brian and determined that the following would need to be done before we could propose anything to the RTA Board – 1) Obtain a third bid (Kevin A.); 2) Determine alternatives for lighting and security camera (Kevin A.); 3) Discuss this with ECC members (Jim S.); 4) Discuss this with L&L committee (Kevin A.); 5) Create a drawing of where located and access routes (Jim S.); and 6) RTA create a flyer to be handed out with boat sticker sales about this opportunity. The following will need to be considered by the Board before a decision is made – 1) create a waiver form; 2) create rules for the boat slip area; 2) how will interested parties be selected for the limited number of slips; 3) is \$500 reasonable for six to seven months of usage; 4) how close should this be to the swimming area; and 5) what kind of access path will be needed. Goal – Proposal to Board in April.

Parking Lot Oil & Rock sealing project: Darrel Hedman and Suzanne Wheeler will contact RA Cullinan, Tazewell Blacktop, and Spoon River and request the following: 1) determine the critical spots on all three lots that need to go down to the dirt and be built back up; 2) prioritize the other spots that will eventually need total rework in future years; and 3) obtain bids to fix the critical spots and oil and rock all three lots. Goal – Proposal to Board in April.

30-Year Planning project: The Land & Lakes committee meeting will be scheduled as soon as possible.

Reserve Study: The ILRPC will review this list after the boat slips and parking lot projects are presented to the Board.


Goal for 2015: Create the 30-year planning document with estimates for the next two years obtained.
