CAMELOT ROUND TABLE ASSOCIATION BOARD MEETING MINUTES (UNAPPROVED) June 15, 2016

<u>Pledge of Allegiance</u> - Board Member John Hecker began the evening by asking the group to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Call to Order</u> – President Steve Harenberg called the meeting to order at 6:33 p.m. Board Members present were Leah Allison, John Hecker, Scott Perkins, Bob Wilder, Bill Krokos, Bo Pratt and Cathy Doss. Absent was Tony Baker. Also present was Glenda Carlson, Acting General Manager.

President Harenberg read a letter of resignation from board member Tony Baker. Due to other personal commitments he would not be able to complete his term on this Board. The Board accepted his resignation and the community would like to thank him for his service and contribution.

Approval of Minutes – Leah Allison made a motion to approve the May minutes. Bob Wilder seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

<u>Finance Report</u> – Treasurer Leah Allison reported the financial statement for May 2016 to the Board and Members present. The Finance Report was approved as presented.

<u>Recognition of Members and Guests</u> – In attendance were: Brenda Keith, Lot 918; Glen DeLorme, Lot 1033; Bob Janssen, Lot 731; Kevin Arduini, Lot 11; Nick and Paul Stevenson, Lot 442: Dennis Woods, Lot 773; Christopher Mackesy, Lot 375; Brad Closen, Lot 1032; Kris Jouchim, Lot 117; Ann Miller, Lot 887 and Kim DeCesari, Lot 888. Guests Nate Pille and his mother, Ann Pille were also present.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Infrastructure/Long Range Planning</u> - Kevin Arduini reported that Nathan Pille completed the fire hydrant painting within Lake Camelot as part of his Eagle Scout project and that the Board had asked him to be present at this meeting. President Harenberg thanked Nathan on behalf of the community for a job well done and presented him with a small token of appreciation. Kevin further reported that the Committee, at the request of the Board, had met with some roofing contractors with regards to the replacement and/or repair of the roof on the pool house. Kevin indicated they had received two bids substantially different. One contractor recommended replacement as is with a flat roof, the other with a small pitch. He recommended to the Board that they allow the Committee to go back out and obtain three (3) bids on the applications and to come back to the board with comparative costs for it. The Board asked the Committee to proceed. See Page 10 for the Infrastructure Meeting Minutes for June 2016.

<u>Land and Lakes</u> – John Hecker reported on the Land and Lakes Committee meeting held June 1, 2016. John informed the Committee that he had made a visual inspection of the work being done in Ravine #9 by FCI Excavating and that everything looked good. He encouraged other members to look at the work done on this project should they get the chance. He also reported that he felt his Committee should be involved with the establishment of guidelines for shoreline stabilization that Board Member Scott Perkins had proposed to the Board. He will take the next steps to proceed with the recommendations. Further discussion was held regarding upcoming projects for erosion control that will be discussed at the next meeting. The next meeting of the Land and Lakes Committee will be held July 6, 2016 at 6:30 p.m.

<u>Health and Environment</u> – No Report.

<u>Dredging Committee - No Report.</u>

<u>Security Report</u> – Kris Jouchim reported on two boat fines that have been issued in the last thirty days for violations. The Board would like to remind members that enforcement of the boating regulations are strictly for the safety of our patrons and the Boating Sticker Agreement you sign when purchasing your boat stickers in the Lake Camelot office specifically states there will be NO VERBAL warnings. The fine fee for first violations is \$50. The Board and Security cannot stress enough the need for knowing and applying the rules of safety when on the Lakes at Camelot. Please follow the rules for Boating Regulations within the Lake Camelot Declaration of Restrictive Covenants/Bylaws and Rules and Regulations.

CLUB REPORTS

Activities Club- Cathy Doss reported that there were seven members present at the June meeting. The Activities Club members approved the purchase of a new diving board for the Lake Camelot pool in the amount of \$3,150.00, which includes the diving board, delivery and installation. The Board would like to give a BIG THANKS to the Activities Club for this purchase. The General Manager reported that the AC President had confirmed the sliced ice/snow cone people would be setting up a tent at the fourth of July and have agreed to pay the one time fee of \$350. Discussion was held regarding the time of set up and the Board agreed that they should wait to set up after 12:00 when the parade and the ice cream float stand are about finished. The next Trivia Night is scheduled August 26, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. There will be no July meeting of the Activities Club. The next meeting will be held August 10, 2016 in the Lake Camelot Clubhouse.

Sportsman's Club –Scott Perkins reported that the Father-Son Camping event at Lake Camelot down at the baseball field will be held July 9, 2016. The cost is \$5.00 per child. The Sportsman's Club will again be making a monetary donation for supplies for food, drink, etc for the camp out. They are preparing for the 4th of July festivities on July 2nd. The next meeting of the Sportsman's Club will be held Friday, July 1st at 8:00 p.m.

ECC -Applications: Scott Perkins

A motion was made by Bo Pratt to accept all ECC applications as presented to the Board by the ECC, with the exceptions stated below, John Hecker seconded, motion carried. Accepted were Nafzinger, Lot 71-Replacement of Concrete Stoop; Overton, Lot 138 - Remove failed tie-wall, Replace with rip rap; Sorenson, Lot 167- Requesting deadline extension for new construction build; Garman, Lot 416 - Pergola addition to Deck; Payne, Lot 435 - Install Concrete Patio; Lane, Lot 478 Deadline extension; Lynch, Lot 877- Add poured concrete drive extension, approach to lower garage and paved sidewalk to dock; seawall (elec & water to dock); Lot 916, Gresham - Remove existing dock and install concrete patio, extend roof over new patio; Lot 918, Keith - Install non-attached garage and Lot 1025, Morr - Placement of a Yard Sign. A motion was made by Bill Krokos to allow the sign for thirty (30) days from the date of this approval with placement not to obstruct the flow of vehicle traffic. Bob Wilder seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote- 6 Yeas, 2 Nays. Motion Carried. Lot 1032, Closen- New deck, patio and replacement of tie wall. Bill Krokos made a motion to approve this work that was presented at this meeting and not on the ECC list. Scott Perkins seconded. All in favor. motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Monthly Violation Reports/Update – The General Manager reported on the violations and written complaints received in the month of May to present. Letters have been sent to those members and follow ups will be scheduled in the appropriate amount of time given for corrections to be made. Harker's Corner/Beautification Project: The General Manager stated she had received a call from Logan Township Road Commissioner, Kevin Sipp with regards to the installation of the posts and gravel on the township's right-of-way. He stated that the township had some concerns regarding liability. Their attorney has prepared a waiver for the association to sign, releasing them from any liability. After it has been reviewed with our insurance agent and our association's attorney, the Board has agreed to pay the cost of the preparation of the waiver and for it to be signed.

<u>FCI Culvert Repair -Ravine #9 -</u> The General Manager reported she had spoken to Terry Beckman from FCI and he had indicated that the work has been completed. John Hecker, as reported within the Land & Lakes report has viewed the area and invited other members to do the same.

<u>Jaedco (Rush) Contract-</u> The General Manager reported that Mr. Rush has submitted a written report on his work thus far and copies of this report will be distributed to the board for review. Joe stated that he has two or three more visits here and will schedule a date and time for his next visit within the next couple of weeks. Work on the water-testing program continues.

4th of July Festivities - The General Manager gave an update of the activity going on for the 4th of July festivities coming up on July 2, 2016. All material has been received in compiling the application for permission to set off a firework display with Logan-Trivoli Fire Department and delivered to Fire Chief David Tuttle's station. Delivery and set up of the firework display, the generator, the staging, the port-a-potties, and the garbage receptacles have all been confirmed. Scheduling of staff, security, police patrol, band, Mr. Janssen's beautiful voice, boy scouts and all vendors complete.

<u>Pool House Ventilation</u> - Fritch Heating and Cooling completed the installation of the ventilation fan prior to the pool opening. The General Manager reported a huge difference inside the pump room. The ventilation fan was installed to help prevent so much deterioration of equipment and cool down the pumps that must run 24/7 over the summer months.

Tree/ Brush Removal - Clubhouse Hillside - Work in Progress

<u>Fire Department /Open House</u>- The fire department open house was held on June 5th and well attended by the membership. Thank you to the Logan-Trivoli Fire Department and the members of our Lake Camelot Volunteer team for all you do! Congratulations on the beautiful facility!

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Lancaster Bridge Closing</u> - The General Manager reported that there will be a meeting held by the Peoria County Highway Department at Illini Bluffs High School on June 21, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. in the theatre. Members of Lake Camelot have been invited to attend for questions regarding the closing of the Lancaster Bridge.

<u>Logan Township/Roadway Cutbacks</u> - Kevin Sipp had reported he was allocated some new equipment that would allow him to make cutbacks along the side of some of the roadways in Camelot to help prevent the pooling of water on the actual road. This will also help reduce the formation of ice, allowing for better driving conditions in the winter. Thanks to Kevin Sipp / Logan Township!

<u>2016-2017 Lake Camelot Telephone Directories</u> - The General Manager reported the new directories are being printed and will be distributed to the membership prior to the next meeting.

Request for Use of Clubhouse Facility/Yoga Class- A request for use of the clubhouse facility was received from Kirsten Hedden, Lot 809 for Yoga Classes to be offered to Lake Camelot community members. After much discussion and reviewing the scheduled events on the community calendar, it was decided by the Board that we would be unable to take on another weekly or monthly event. It was suggested she be advised to check with the fire station to see if they would allow something like that within their facility.

<u>Request for Reconsideration of Age Requirements/Swimming Pool</u>—Ann Miller, Lot 887- requested the Board look to change the age requirement of children entering the pool without someone over the age of 16 with a child (or children) 12 and under. She has a 14 year old that is allowed by the State of Illinois to watch her younger child under the age of 12 at home but is not allowed to bring them to the pool. The Board thanked Ann for her request and instructed the General Manager to check with other pools in the area to see what they do and will take this under consideration at the next meeting of the Board.

<u>Executive Session</u>- Cathy Doss made a motion to go into executive session at 8:15 p.m., seconded by Bob Wilder. All in Favor, Motion carried. Motion was made by Bill Krokos to come out of Executive Session at 9:20 p.m., seconded by Bo Pratt. All in Favor, Motion carried.

Action Resulting From Executive Session - The Board unanimously chose not to replace retired member Tony Baker at this time. His position is up for re-lection in 2016 and will be re-elected with a new member at that time. With the summer months upon us and the RTA staff going from 5 to 35+, Bill Krokos made a motion to give the General Manager the responsibility of hiring and/or releasing any employee of the Lake Camelot RTA Staff. Bo Pratt seconded. All in Favor, motion carried.

Adjournment - Motion was made by Bill Krokos and seconded by Bob Wilder to adjourn the meeting at 9:27 p.m. All in Favor, Motion carried.



Homeowners Association/ Effective Communications

Effective communication helps to establish harmony in the community. The more effective the communication, the more successful will be the management of the association. A difficult aspect of communications is assuring that owners within a community have the opportunity to receive and/or access information. There are numerous methods for the association to facilitate good communications.

Informing a potential buyer: The first step to keeping the member informed about the association

- Create an information booklet, brochure, or packet that briefs the potential buyer on the association
- Review the association documents and/or the state statutes to determine what information the association is required to provide to a potential buyer **Explain how members can become involved and participate in the association**

Welcome letters/committee: After a new member moves in, assist them in learning about their community

- Provide a brief explanation of what the association is responsible for as outlined in the Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions (CC&R's)
- Announce the name of the management company and/or the Association Manager. Provide a list of documents that the new homeowner should have received when closing escrow on the property
- Provide a map of the project that shows where the association amenities and facilities are located
- Provide an explanation of the annual assessments; when assessments are due
- Detail when the Board meets, if applicable

Have the Welcome Committee greet new members

Annual member meetings and annual reports: An excellent opportunity to showcase the association to its membership

- Hold the annual members' meeting as required by the bylaws of the association.
- Provide a recap of the past year's accomplishments.

Report on the upcoming year's activities and goals.

Association Newsletter: One of the primary vehicles for communicating with the members throughout the year

- The Association should establish an ongoing, scheduled newsletter program
- The goal of the newsletter should be to communicate a full range of information to the membership
- Recruit homeowner reporters to draft articles
- Always include articles about board briefings and/or minutes from board and/or annual meetings
- Make the communication fun and easy to read
- Use tasteful graphics to explain key points

Include consumer features, such as legal issues, trends, and general information that matches the demographics of the members
