



CAMELOT ROUND TABLE ASSOCIATION BOARD MEETING MINUTES (UNAPPROVED)

October 21, 2015

<u>Call to Order</u> – President Steve Harenberg called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. Board Members present were Gary Smith, Cathy Doss, Bill Krokos, Matt Buczynski and Leah Allison. Absent were Brian Woertz and Bo Pratt. Also present was Glenda Carlson, Acting General Manager and Jennifer McKenzie, Manager Trainee.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Gary Smith made a motion to approve the September minutes, seconded by Leah Allison. All in favor, motion carried.

Member Resignation/New Appointed-Cathy Doss stated that Cody Martzluf had submitted a letter of resignation to the Board. Leah Allison had made a motion to approve Cody's resignation & appoint Jake Gelhausen-Lot 367, to finish the term. Matt Buczynksi seconded it, all in favor. Motion carried. This was an email vote on September 17,2015. Cathy Doss further reported Brian Woertz had provided a proxy assigned to Gary Smith for the purpose of voting on his behalf as this meeting.

<u>Finance Report</u> – Treasurer Leah Allison reported the financial statement for September to the Board and Members present. The Finance Report was approved as presented.

<u>Recognition of Members and Guests</u> – In attendance were Janis Earle, Lot 53; Don Thompson, Lot 405; Glen DeLorme, Lot 1033; Bernie Sieks, Lot 665; Brandon Lohnes, Lot 22; Mike Haffner, Lot 616; Bob Wilder, Lot 122; Suzanne Wheeler, Lot 562, and Gordon Young, Lot 200.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Infrastructure</u> –Suzanne Wheeler reported to the Board that the committee is continuing work on the 30-year planning project. These committee meetings are open to Lake Camelot members in good standing. This is a time & place where members will discuss the use of RTA Lake Camelot common property. Suzanne stated they were looking for help in taking down the fence at the old baseball field. Mike Haffner, Bob Wilder, and Brandon Lohnes offered to help. We appreciate all volunteers, thanks! Nate Pille will do the painting of the fire hydrants next Spring, which is through the Boy Scouts as an Eagle Scout project. The Minutes from October Infrastructure Meeting are contained within this newsletter.

<u>Land and Lakes</u> – Steve Harenberg reported that Greg Dennis, Bruce Whelchel, Collin Cochran, and himself had completed most of the work project at Harker's Corner. The siltation was removed from two erosion areas and put to dry out on the holding pond up on the hill. For more information please read their report in the newsletter.

Health and Environment – No Report.

<u>Dredging Committee-</u> Bill Krokos reported his committee had no meeting this month. The Lake Survey Questionnaire went out in the October newsletter this month and many have been returned. The Committee still needs to meet to review them and will also be working together with Land and Lakes to coordinate a updated a lake management plan. Jake Gelhausen will take the lead on this with Land and Lakes. The previously approved core sampling on the lakes is not being done at this time; however, testing will still be needed when we begin the permitting process in the future. The consultants continue to obtain information and preliminary numbers for erosion, research, etc. The next meeting will be held Nov. 12th @ 6:30 p.m. at the clubhouse. Please read the committee report in the newsletter.






